Learning to be part of a community is an important aspect of Adolescent Programs. This is accomplished through trips and weekly community meals. At least twice a year, the adolescents go on multi-day trips that they help to plan and organize. The focus is building up a sense of community and the importance of working together. They are also responsible for planning and cooking meals from scratch every week. In addition to developing strong cooking skills and knowledge of nutrition, students also learn to host when families or other staff are invited to join in.

X-terms are in-depth experiential sessions in which the students can do a deep dive into a subject area of their own interest that doesn't neatly fit into other areas of the curriculum. Students are deeply involved in the planning and execution of the X-term, from concept to final experience. They come up with the initial idea, then find ways to turn those ideas into an immersive experience, funded by their economic work. Sometimes, this means traveling, and other times, it means transforming an existing space. At the end of the experience, there is the opportunity for sharing with the community, whether this is a presentation, a product, or a visit. Students are limited only by their own creativity and willingness to work to pay for the experience.

Adolescent students also participate in Summer Economic Work sessions. Since the experience of production and exchange is an important part of any adolescent program, these focused summer terms give students the skills they need to engage fully with economic work. This year, one session focuses on making things from scratch - bread, pastas, sauces, utensils, quilts, candles, and any other type of good they're interested in. The second session focuses on animal science, providing a deep dive into animal physiology, and animal husbandry, introducing and strengthening skills in caring for our campus animals, as well as local animal related excursions, dissections, and animal ethics discussions.

### Pricing

The cost of one X-term is rolled into tuition for the previous school year. The cost of one additional X-term is \$800. Registration is first come, first served. Payment is due in full at the time of registration and is to be paid through FACTS.

A late pick-up fee of \$35.00 will be assessed for any student who is picked up after 3:45 pm.

### Cancellations

Registration cancellations received on or before June 1, 2024, are eligible for a 75% refund. No refunds will be issued for cancellations after June 1, 2024. Exceptions may be made for extraordinary circumstances at the discretion of the Head of School.

The school reserves the right to cancel a program if minimum enrollment is not met.

### What to Bring

Students enrolling in X-terms should bring a water bottle, sunscreen, bug spray, morning snack, lunch, and a change of clothes.

### Medical Authorization
